UMKC professor emeritus and wife make \$1 million gift to School of Education

A University of Missouri-Kansas City professor emeritus and his wife, an alumna, have made the largest individual gift commitment in the history of the university's School of Education.

The gift, valued at about \$1 million, was made by Warren H. Wheelock and Connie J. Campbell to fund the Dr. Warren Wheelock Scholarship in Reading Education

Serving at UMKC for about 40 years, Wheelock formerly was a professor of education and director of the Reading Clinic in the Language and Literacy Group.

Campbell, president of CW Interventions, an associated partnership of experts in the fields of education, has served as president of The Learning Exchange and was the founding chief executive officer of Experiencia Inc. — an education company providing immersive learning programs for elementary schoolchildren.
